
PISEON FEST



In celebration of Iván Argote's *Dinosaur*—the striking 17-foot-tall aluminum pigeon sculpture at the Spur on the High Line—and National Pigeon Appreciation Day, the High Line presents Pigeon Fest, a free full-day festival celebrating pigeons, urban ecology, and public art.
